PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: *No more than two (2) courses may be taken in the same division (Humanities, Math and Science, and Social Sciences).*

Natural Science & Mathematics: ASTR, BIOL, CHEM, COMS, MATH, PHYS

Social Science: BUSI, ECON, GVFA, HIST, PSYC

Students in the Environmental Studies program must take 18 credit hours from courses designed to introduce them to the scientific, social scientific, and humanistic concepts of environmental issues.

- _____ d) one course chosen from ENGL 199 or RELI 103, 225
- _____ e) one additional course, from a different department chosen from parts c) or d)*
- _____ f) INDS 372 (capstone project) (spr.)

*With prior approval of the Environmental Studies Steering Committee, students may fulfill part e) with HIST 299, RHET 360, or RHET 370 provided that the section focuses on environmental issues. Special Topics (x85) courses centered on environmental issues may also be used to fulfill parts b) and e) with **prior** approval of the Steering Committee.
