A minor in a modern language requires 18 credit hours in the language at the <u>300- and 400-level</u>. Three to six (3-6) credit hours of study at an approved institution in a foreign country in which the language is spoken are **strongly recommended**-- plan accordingly! - When choosing a course, select courses that will **enhance your language skills** first! Be sure to read carefully the pre-requisites and the skill levels required. A 301 course is NOT necessarily easier than a 305 course.
- Do not take a 400-level course in your first year of the minor, unless advised by your instructor, advisor, or Department chair.
- Minors are encouraged to strike a balance among courses on language, culture, and literature.
- Minors should consider joining the Foreign Language Honors Society, Language Clubs, and participating in the Conversation Table for Advanced Students. Please see your instructor for current meeting times and locations.
