Important information for majors:

- You do not have to be religious to major in religion. Each year, several religion majors attend seminary after graduation, but the majority of students develop careers in business, law, education, social work, and military service.
- Because there are few pre-requisites within the Religion coursework, it is easy to double major or even minor in religion.
- It is recommended for Religion majors to take 6 hrs in Philosophy courses, although only GREK 303, PHIL 217 and SOCY 305 may be counted towards required hours for the major.
- Students may be interested in participating in one or more of the campus ministry organizations and take advantage of non-profit service activities on campus or within the local community. Common co-curricular programs of interest include the McRae Program for Religion and Society, the Hobbie Business Ethics Program and the Wilson Center Leadership in the Public Interest Program. Religion majors may even be interested in INDS 320—Philanthropy in theory and practice.
- Students interested in the McRae Program for Religion and Society should plan on taking Religious Autobiography the fall of their sophomore or junior year.
- Students interested in graduate work in religious studies should complete RELI 245.
- Students wishing to do departmental honors in religion should really consider summer honors research the summer before their senior year. Consult your RELI faculty early in your junior year.
